Media Release – De dwa da dehs nye>s expansion of Primary Care Services into the Niagara Region

April 27th, 2022

The provincial government is funding the expansion of Primary Care Services in the Niagara Region, delivered by De dwa da dehs nye>s Aboriginal Health Centre.

This investment provides the Indigenous community of Niagara with access to culturally safe care provided by physicians and Nurse Practitioners. The addition of Primary care will complement the broader allied health programs currently offered by De dwa da dehs nye>s in the Niagara Region.

“As an Indigenous physician and past member of the Board of De dwa da dehs nye>s I celebrate the infusion of much needed resources to support the health and well-being of Indigenous people in Niagara,” notes Dr. Bradley Johnson, Chronic Pain Specialist.

De dwa da dehs nye>s is the only urban Indigenous health care provider in the greater Brantford/Brant and Hamilton areas that provides a blend of western and Indigenous Traditional Medicine and as such is an integral part of the health care and social service system for urban First Nations, Inuit, and Metis people.

“We are excited to be able to extend our reach into the Niagara Region, an area that has a long historical gap of culturally safe services in this area,” said Bryanne Smart, Board Chair.
