<u>Overview</u>

The job of the Registered Nurse (RN) requires a thorough knowledge of primary care nursing and the ability to function effectively in a team environment with physicians, nurses, allied health professionals and administrative staff. The role also requires a high level of interpersonal skills to interact with patients and their families of all ages. In addition, the RN possesses and utilizes the knowledge, skill, and judgment to function autonomously within the RN full scope of practice while collaborating with other members of the multidisciplinary team to ensure optimal health outcomes.

The main function of this position it to provide community primary care services to Indigenous individuals who are experiencing poverty and/or significant barriers to accessing health care through the following:

- Nurse outreach to local Indigenous organizations and community partners to facilitate groups on health promotion and preventative health topics (e.g. sexual health, healthy babies, pre/post-natal education and other areas of need identified)
- Provide 1 to 1 nursing visits and support with clients of Indigenous organizations
- Provides primary care health care within our Hamilton clinic including immunizations, injections, bloodwork, well-baby support, triaging, clinic inventory management, working under medical directives etc.

Roles and Responsibilities

Provide patient oriented, goal directed nursing care in accordance with the standards of care from the College of Nurses of Ontario. The Registered Nurse (RN) should possess the ability to work to their full scope of practice in a primary care setting to:

- administer vaccinations (support COVID-19 vaccinations as needed)
- perform nursing interventions as required
- work as part of an interdisciplinary team which provides shared care to support patient care
- use knowledge, skill, and judgment to triage incoming patient calls, assess patient's health needs, discuss test results, and respond to questions as appropriate
- maintain accurate, concise, and confidential EMR documentation
- communicate ideas and concerns to the health care team and participate in problem solving
- participate in staff meetings and review current organizational operations
- provide mutual support to other clinical staff, colleagues, and other staff members
- facilitate and coordinate clinical programs and involvement with system changes and improvements to enhance team and work processes, and patient care
- Participate in interdisciplinary team development activities
- Teach and mentor family medicine residents, nursing, and other health professional students as appropriate.
